**Final Transcripts/Scholarships** – Once you decide which college or university you will attend, you must inform the Counseling Center where to send your final transcript. If you do not request a final transcript you may encounter problems once you get to your college or university. They often do not let students register for second semester of their freshman year without a final transcript. Additionally, you need to report all of the scholarships you earned, whether you are accepting them or not.
