WHAT IS NATIONAL BOARD CERTIFICATION®?

National Board Certification is a voluntary assessment program designed to identify great teachers — and make them better. While state licensing systems set basic requirements to teach in each state, National Board Certified Teachers have successfully demonstrated advanced teaching knowledge, skills and practices.

- Like board-certified doctors and accountants, teachers who achieve National Board Certification have met advanced standards through intensive study, expert evaluation, self-assessment and peer review.
- Certification takes one to three years to achieve and is available nationwide.
- Twenty-five certificates are available for a variety of developmental levels and subjects — including literacy, English, math, science and health education.
- The process includes assessment of subject knowledge, submissions of video recordings of classroom instruction and examples of student work.
- About 40 percent of candidates achieve certification the first year; about
 65 percent do so by the end of the three-year cycle.
- All 50 states, the District of Columbia and more than 700 school districts recognize National Board Certification as a mark of distinction.
- Broad support for National Board Certification comes from the federal government,
 Democratic and Republican governors and legislators, state and local governments
 and school boards, the nation's two largest teacher unions, higher education,
 education organizations and classroom teachers.

National Board Certified Teachers consistently receive top honors while representing just over two percent of the nation's teaching population.

National Board Certification is administered by the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards® (NBPTS), an independent, nonprofit, nonpartisan and non-governmental organization. NBPTS advances the quality of teaching and learning by developing professional standards for accomplished teaching, creating a voluntary system to certify teachers who meet those standards and integrating certified teachers into educational reform efforts.
