# II. Notas (grades)

#### A. HABLAR

Speak Spanish as much as possible – you won't get points for every time you do, nor will you lose points for every error. Quit worrying
about points and just speak Spanish!

2. IB Oral Exams – 3 group oral exams (October, November, December or January) and 1 individual oral in February I grade these and send them to Cardiff, so you get a grade in class as well as them counting for IB. This is your *Internal Assessment* and 30% of your IB grade (15% group/15% individual). I use the IB oral rubric, with a scale (for class).

### 3. Teaching in the elementary schools (first semester only)

You will teach a class of elementary students, alone or with a classmate. Your first oral exam is just over a month away. Teaching helps you a) review basics and b) build confidence. I will help you to prepare beforehand, and you will create your own lessons and materials. You are graded on the timely completion of quality lesson plans, a written reflection after the fact and actually teaching. There will be make-up opportunities if you miss. It is YOUR responsibility to call your elementary teacher AND your teaching partner if you are unable to come.

# 4. Discussion groups (second semester only)

Each student will prepare and lead a 50-min. discussion in Spanish about a chosen topic affecting a Spanish-speaking country and will participate in Spanish discussion during others' discussions.

#### B. **ESCRIBIR**

- You will learn other content USING Spanish, not just learn the language. The focus is proficiency, not just measuring how well you studied
  for an assessment. Does studying help? Of course, but some of you will need to study to practice more than others.
- 2. Timed writes: given a prompt in Spanish, you will write a well-developed response in Spanish, graded using the IB rubric. Second semester you will do weekly journals. These all prepare you for *Paper 2* of the *External Assessment*, which is worth 30% of your IB Spanish grade. I grade your practices using the IB written rubric, using a scale. The real thing is done in May off campus.
- 3. **Grammar quizzes:** We'll have a few of these, but not many. They will require *understanding*, applying concepts in context, not just memorization of grammar rules, so get help sooner than later if you're lost!
- 4. **Practice IB exams:** Especially during the 2<sup>nd</sup> semester, you will do practice activities and old exams preparing you for *Paper 1*, also referred to as *manejo de textos*, of the *External Assessment* which is worth 40% of your IB grade. It is done with paper 2 in May.
- 5. Diarios semanales (2<sup>nd</sup> semester only): Once a week a journal completed outside of class will be due on turn-it-in.com. These journals are preparation for paper 2 of the IB exam. Assigned in January, you may or may not be reminded, mark your calendar & keep up.

# III. Tips for success from Señora:

- 1. Informate Go to my IB Spanish Page on Millard North's website and check out some of the links for extra practice. Learn the format of the exam. Knowing is half the battle!
- 2. Study a little every day the amount of time you spend outside of class learning and using Spanish has a direct impact on your success in class. The IB exam is not something you can memorize a bunch of vocabulary or grammar rules for at last minute. You must live it. Watch Univisión, listen to Juanes, check out books from Señora, chat in Spanish with a friend or visit South O. How fluent can you get by the end of the year? Remember, your last oral exam for IB is February. 10-12 tough minutes if you don't prepare. Don't put off practicing any longer!
